

HEAVY EQUIPMENT OPERATOR I/II

NATURE OF WORK

This is manual work in the operation of small to heavy equipment used in park construction and park maintenance. Employees may be required to operate a variety of equipment, to perform laboring duties, and use heavy earth moving equipment occasionally. Supervision is received from the Director.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

Operates mowing equipment, loader, back hoe, motor grader, dump truck used in transportation of various material; washes, services and makes minor adjustments and repairs to assigned equipment; reports need for maintenance or repair of equipment to supervisor; participates in maintenance construction and laboring work as directed; performs other duties as assigned.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities

Knowledge of the operation and maintenance of standard construction equipment; knowledge of the hazards of operation and of appropriate safety rules and regulations; knowledge of traffic laws, ordinances and rules governing equipment operation; ability to detect needed mechanical work and make necessary minor adjustments; ability to understand and carry out oral instructions and to work independently in the performance of regular duties; skilled in the operation of assigned equipment.

Training and Experience

Graduation from a standard high school, GED or trade school; two (2) years experience in the operation of automotive and construction equipment; or an equivalent combination of training and experience.

Special Requirements

Valid Florida CDL.
