

FINAL PUBLIC NOTICE

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has received the subgrant application for the City of Lynn Haven's Wastewater Treatment Plant repairs and replacements due to damages in Hurricane Michael (DR-4399-FL PW 02068). Pursuant to Executive Order 11988 and 44 CFR Part 9.12, final notice is hereby given of FEMA's intent to provide funding for this project under the Public Assistance (PA) Program.

An initial disaster-wide Public Notice was published October 30, 2018 for Hurricane Michael. Comments and other information received were fully evaluated by FEMA along with evaluation of social, economic, environmental, and safety considerations. This notice serves as a project-specific final notice for FEMA's funding action located within the floodplain.

Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions. This action complies with the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) requirements.

- Floodplain:** Project is located in the AE Zone, otherwise known as the area of 1% annual chance for flooding up to the base flood elevation, per Bay County FIRM Panels # 12005C0218H and 12005C0331H dated 06/02/2009
- Proposed Work and Purpose:** The City of Lynn Haven will temporarily dewater the storage pond for chloride liner replacement in addition to the repairs and replacements to wastewater treatment plant equipment and infrastructure. Date of Construction 1996, No hazard mitigation proposal attached to this project. The total cost is \$1,051,301.00.
- Project Alternatives:** FEMA considered the no-action alternative, as is required by Title 44 Code of Federal Regulations Part 9.9 and found that the no-action alternative was not feasible as the wastewater treatment plant provide the community with essential hygiene health and waste water needs for daily life. Removal or permanent closure of the WWTP would likely have adverse impacts on the social and economic wellbeing of the community. Alternate locations were not considered as the WWTP are functionally dependent on their current location.
